

IMPORTANT VIEWS ASSESSMENT

In response to the request for the community most cherished views in the parish in October 2017, the following suggestions were made:

Comment	View #
Barn End field opposite the telephone exchange	
Behind Barn End Cottage towards Kings Stag & Red Barn.	
Behind Hillview House to church/school.	
Behind Village Hall.	
Bulbarrow Hill across to Blackmoor Vale	
Cemetery to allotment area.	
Church – around the School, Silly Hill, Churchfoot Lane.	
Copse along footpath above LGS-TC (cemetery) + footpath to the east through to school – view of Village/rural surroundings.	
Field directly behind Drum Lane with Hardy Way footpath heading to Droop with Bulbarrow beyond.	
Field next to cemetery, brilliant views.	
Field opposite school, footpath has wonderful panoramic views.	
Fields around cemetery	
Footpath Drum Lane to Church – views SW to Dorset Gap, N towards Stourhead, NW to Wonston. Also includes historic plague pit.	
Footpath from Coney Lane to Wonston – view across fields to Bulbarrow.	
Footpath from Drum Lane to Droop (opp school)	
From Kingston to Bulbarrow	
From lanes around Village school, green spaces surrounding H/Bryan village school, wonderful views, quiet, unspoilt.	
From the lynch gate and lane by the Church looking out & across unspoilt countryside towards Malt House.	
Many fine views from lanes around Droop in vicinity of HB School. An area unchanged in my living memory.	
Overall looking out to Blackmore Vale.	
Site 20 affords fantastic views and should be protected. Also strong winds.	
Site 20 opposite the school.	
Site 20/21 HB highest point with long 360 degree views	
Sites 20 & 21 offer 360 degree view of surrounding area and are very visible from the Village.	
The clump opposite the cemetery where footpath passes through	
The footpath at the top of the hill linking site 20 & 21. This area should be protected green space where you have views of Village & Bulbarrow.	
The view from the top of Churchfoot Lane across countryside towards church & school.	
To Bulbarrow	
View behind Village Hall?Red Barn footpath. View from Wonston towards Bulbarrow/Mapowder & Droop. Views from LGS-NR.	


View from before & after cemetery towards Bulbarrow.

From these four views were selected as key views that were important to the community as a whole:

Ref	Location	View Description
V1	Cemetery	Panoramic view looking south-west from the highest point in Wonston, giving a view of open agricultural land and Wonston hamlet, against a backdrop of distant hills (Church Hill, Ball Hill, Nettlecombe Tout & Lyscombe Hill, Dorset Gap)
V2	Kingston Cross Lane	Focused view looking south-east along Kingston Cross Lane, the highpoint in Kingston, across open agricultural land towards Bulbarrow Hill
V3	Coney Lane to Wonston Public Footpath	Panoramic view looking east across open agricultural land towards Bulbarrow Hill, capturing the beauty of the landscape in the Blackmore Vale.
V4	Drum Lane to Droop Public Footpath N41/15	Panoramic view looking east across open countryside towards Bell Hill, capturing the beauty of the landscape in the Blackmore Vale.

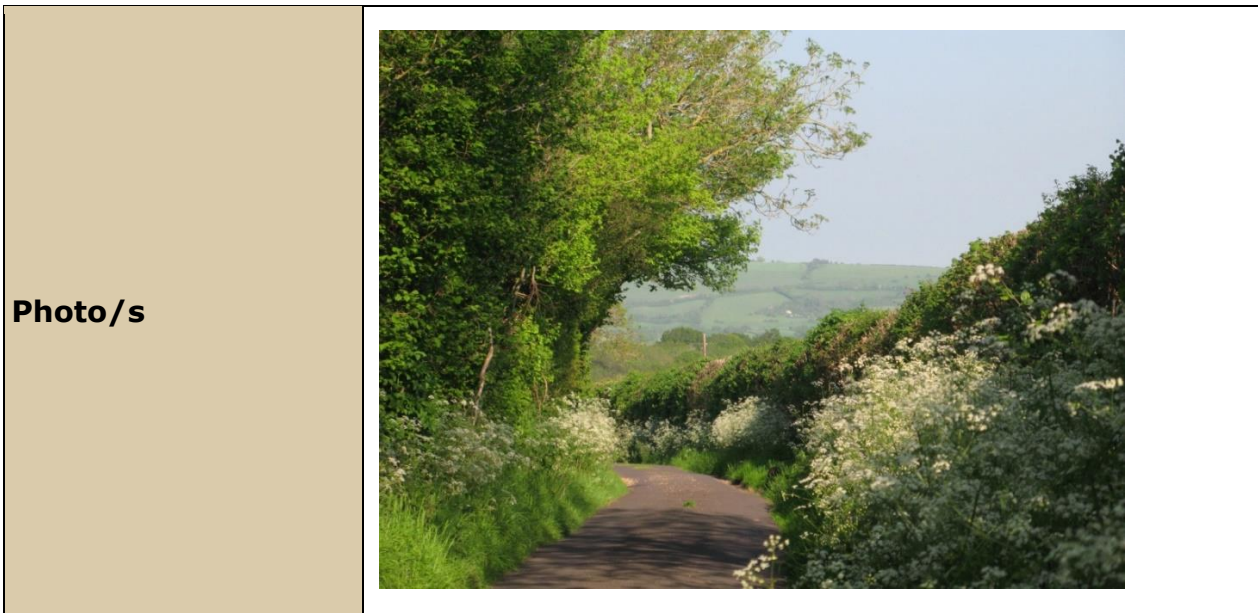
